



7 countries now replace the [former Yugoslavia](#) : [Slovenia \(SLO\)](#), [Croatia \(HR\)](#), [Bosnia Herzegovina \(BIH\)](#), [Kosovo \(KS\)](#), [Northern Macedonia \(NMK\)](#), [Serbia \(SRB\)](#) and [Montenegro \(MNE\)](#).
Before the 90s wars, registrations had distinctive 2 letters that are still used in these 5 countries : Slovenia, Croatia, NorthernMacedonia, Serbia and Montenegro.

During the war, the [Moslem](#) part also used *BR*, the [Srpska Republika](#) used codes in cyrillic,
Herceg Nova with its flag used these codes : *BU ČA DR GR JA KI KO LI LJ MO OR PO RA SB TG TR ŽE*

 [KOSOVO](#) used : *DJ GL KM PE PJ PR PZ TM UR* before the war

 [NORTHERN MACEDONIA](#) : BT GV KU OH PP **SK** SR ŠT TE TV
